



Quadrilateral Engagement, and Deeper Analysis:

- I. <u>Quadrilateral Engagement</u> in addition to the IEA and OPEC, the other organisations such as the Gas Exporting Countries Forum (GECF) are partners on the neutral IEF platform creating a more robust and comprehensive interface between international organizations.
- II. <u>Deeper Analysis:</u> The launch of a monthly comparative analysis on IEA and OPEC shortterm oil market reports by the IEF deepens energy market insights and strengthens market transparency.
